- Special care should be taken to protect the rights of the minority from undue infringement by the majority and to protect the well-being of the vulnerable, particularly women and children.

Economic and social inequity damages the moral fabric of societies and weakens democratic governments. People should act freely to implement measures that promote equality of opportunity for their fellow human beings.



Advocate for policies that give all children a chance to learn, grow, and become thriving citizens.

- > As the foundational setting where the seeds of ethics, civics, service, and patterns of connection are sowed, thriving families support a healthy democracy and society.
- > Vulnerable families and children need additional scaffolding to have a fair shot at life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.
- Proactive interventions for families and children, designed to reduce negative effects of vulnerable circumstances, are morally expedient and economically wise.

- > Helping families find and stay on a positive trajectory leads to self-sufficiency and benefits the neighborhood, community, economy, and society where they live.
