- Responsibility to exercise stewardship over the earth and its resources should not be a partisan issue.
 - > Climate change threatens a wide range of human rights and needs to be addressed through systemic action.



- Encourage good stewardship of the earth.
 - Important environmental issues include healthy water systems, clean water supply, clear air, and land conservation.
- Promote clean energy sources and conservation to mitigate climate change.
 - We implore leaders at the local, state, and federal levels to set aside politics in pursuit of policies that will aggressively and immediately address this worldwide threat.
 - Individual efforts to safeguard the earth are important but insufficient on their own; reasonable, well-written policies can help to ensure sustainability and promote clean air.
- Acknowledge the inequitable burden of pollution and work with all stakeholders to reduce pollution.
 - Climate change, pollution, and overdevelopment disproportionately impact members of society who are most vulnerable. As we care for the Earth, we are in turn caring for each other.
- Support economic recovery, workforce development, and job training for frontline communities that have depended on the fossil fuel industry, especially those that are marginalized and in rural areas.
