

ENCIRCLE

Build the "beloved community," guided by our six Principles of Peacemaking.

More than 3,000 women joined the new MWEG Portal, including more than 500 sustaining (donating) members.

EDUCATE

Develop a more informed and discerning citizenry.

More than 1,000 women participated in MWEG Town Halls and Deep Dives — virtual events geared toward educating women about pressing issues.

>> FULFILLING OUR OBJECTIVES

EMPOWER

Help women claim their moral authority and prepare them to act upon it for the benefit of all.

We hosted more than 2,000 moderated, cross-partisan discussions in our private member group, giving women a chance to practice peacemaking.

ENGAGE

Act collectively and individually to promote ethical government, oppose injustice, and proactively make peace.

We purchased an advocacy software system that let our members send more than 7,000 letters to members of Congress in just six months.

>> PARTNER HIGHLIGHT BRIDGE ALLIANCE



In 2020, we made special efforts to reach out and form relationships with other organizations. Many were working to protect the right to vote during a pandemic in addition to speaking up for ethical behavior by government leaders. Our nonpartisan values give us the flexibility to collaborate with a variety of organizations, including many within the Bridge Alliance.

The Bridge Alliance is a coalition of more than 100 organizations working together as active stewards of our democratic republic. Bridge Alliance member organizations span the ideological spectrum but are unified to work efficiently, outside arbitrarily defined political lines. We were honored to join the Alliance in 2020.

>> OUR VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers are the lifeblood of MWEG. More than 100 women donate significant time each week to tasks such as updating the MWEG website and member portal, drafting calls to action, meeting with members of Congress, discussing the news together (bringing in a variety of perspectives), moderating our discussion spaces, teaching practical peacemaking skills to our members, and much more. In 2020, our volunteers donated more than 25,000 hours of their time to MWEG!

After I found and joined MWEG in early 2020, I felt pretty confident about identifying bias and outright lies by using MWEG's media literacy tools. Then I stepped into a volunteer role as a discussion moderator, and that's when my real education began. Consulting with a board of smart, articulate, and well-read women about articles and issues the group wanted to discuss taught me how to sift through misinformation as it happened in real-time. Breaking news, especially during an election cycle, can feel like a constant deluge of shocking information. Working with other volunteers meant we could sort through reliable sources together.

>> OUR LEADERSHIP

MWEG's team of 20 leaders are responsible for the day-to-day operations of our organization, including managing all volunteers. In 2020 we were able, for the first time, to offer some compensation to several women in key roles who need to be available on a timely and consistent basis. This new staffing model — made possible by our generous members and donors — allows us to recruit and retain women who will gain institutional knowledge and move our work forward in a committed manner.

Over the last few years, I have dedicated a lot of time and energy to MWEG simply because it is a unique organization with the potential to make an enormous impact. 


